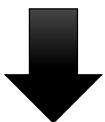

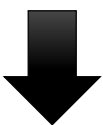




Claudia A. Reinicke, Dipl. Psych., Dresden, Germany

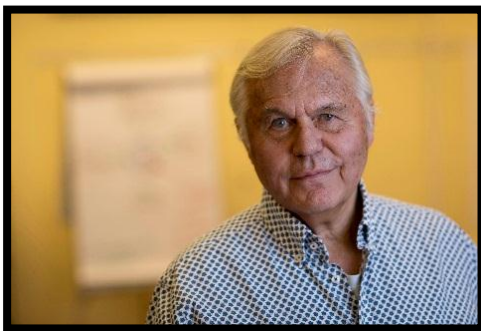
